Did You Know?

Basketball History

 In 1891, James Naismith, a teacher at a YMCA in Springfield, Massachusetts, is credited with inventing basketball. He was looking for an indoor recreational activity.



- The first basketball hoops were actually just peach baskets and the first backboards were made of wire. The backboard was added because the audience who watched the game from the balcony used to interfere in the game by handling the ball. The incorporation of the backboard prevented that from happening.
- The first basketball game was held on January 20, 1892. The court was half the size of courts used at the NBA League today and only one point was scored in the whole match. In this game, there were nine players in each team.
- The first basketball games were played with soccer balls. However, they proved
 to be unsuitable for dribbling and ball handling. The first manufactured basketballs were produced in 1894 by a bicycle manufacturing company. In the late
 1890's Spalding took over as the official ball maker.



- There are 5 five players each on both the teams. The positions are: Point guard, Shooting guard, Small forward, Power forward, and Center. The basketball hoop is 10 ft. tall.
- The Boston Celtics franchise has won the most NBA championships (16) in history.
